## ARCHITECTS

### **Hurdzan Fry Environmental Golf Design**

Hurdzan Fry is a world renowned golf course architectural company located in Columbus, Ohio. Their design philosophy is to design and build golf courses which are enjoyable to play for players of all skill levels and to promote environmental awareness, sound land management and natural resource conservation. They design golf courses so players experience a closeness to nature and golf courses that are environmentally sustainable. They accomplish this by taking a methodical and environmental approach in the routing, design, construction, maintenance and operation of the golf course. Their golf courses not only deliver superior playing conditions, but they do so using less water, fertilizers, pesticides and fossil fuels than other more traditional golf courses.

Hurdzan Fry golf courses have won numerous Golf Digest awards and several have been ranked in the Top 100 in the United States and the Top 50 in Canada. In addition to The Georgian Bay Club, some of their most notable award winning golf courses include Calusa Pines, Devil's Paintbrush, Devil's Pulpit, Dundarave, Naples National, Royal Woodbine, The Club at Bondhead, and Westwood Plateaux.



Dr. Michael J. Hurdzan

An internationally recognized authority on golf course environmental issues, Dr. Michael J. Hurdzan, American Society of Golf Course Architects (ASGCA), studied turf management at Ohio State University and earned a Masters Degree in landscape architecture and a Ph.D. in environmental plant physiology from the University of Vermont. Dr. Hurdzan is an accomplished writer, lecturer and an internationally recognized authority on the design of environmentally responsible golf courses. In 2002 and 2007, Dr. Hurdzan received the Donald Ross Award, the highest honour granted by the American Society of Golf Course Architects. Past recipients of this prestigious award include Gene Sarazen, Jack Nicklaus, Arnold Palmer, Pete Dye, Herbert Warren Wind and Byron Nelson. Holding a Doctorate Degree in Environmental Science, Dr. Hurdzan is a past president of the American Society of Golf Course Architects and current chairman of the Professional Development Committee. In addition, Dr. Hurdzan is the author of one of the industry's best read reference books on golf course design, construction and restoration, title 'Golf Course Architecture'.

Dr. Hurdzan is extremely active in serving his profession and industry. He has taught two-day seminars for the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America (GCSAA) on 'Design, Construction and Renovation' and 'Golf Greens: Theory Design, Construction and Maintenance' in addition to 'Environmental Impacts of Golf Courses' for the Harvard Graduate School of Design. He is a Golf Digest panelist for the publication's environmental awards program, a select delegate for the 'Golf and Environment' conferences and serves on the Educational Review Committee for the GCSAA. He is a former chairman of the Professional Development Committee and member of the Past President's Council. In addition, he is a contributor to the professional development program for the Golf Course Builders Association of America and the PGA.



Dana Fry

In 1997, Dana Fry became a partner with Michael Hurdzan, forming what is today known as Hurdzan Fry Environmental Golf Design. Previously, while attending the University of Arizona and representing their golf team in 1983, Dana met Andy Banfield, a world renowned golf designer and Tom Fazio's lead project manager. During the summer break, just before his senior year, Dana learned about a new project they were starting and was invited to take a look. Shortly afterwards, he was offered a part-time job. One thing lead to another, and soon afterwards Dana was offered a full-time job as a finish shaper with Tom Fazio. In five years with Tom Fazio, Dana learned to see the big picture while thinking outside the box and was eventually involved in 16 new golf courses. In 1988, Mr. Fry left Fazio Golf Course Design to join a burgeoning golf course design team led by Dr. Hurdzan. Shortly after joining the new team, Dana flew to Toronto to oversee the construction of a new course north of the city called the Devil's Pulpit. Dr. Hurdzan immediately recognized Mr. Fry's artistic genius, and in January of 1997, Mr. Fry accepted Dr. Hurdzan's offer to become his partner. They remain both partners and great friends to this day.



Jason Straka

Columbus Ohio based golf course architect Jason Straka, a senior designer with Hurdzan/Fry Environmental Golf Design, has been named to Golf Magazine's prestigious "40 Under 40" list. According to the magazine, those on the list are "The game's up and coming generation of influencers, trendsetters and newsmakers, an eclectic mix of talent worth watching today and for many years to come."

Jason earned a Bachelor's degree in landscape architecture and a Masters Degree in environmental golf course design studies from Cornell University. As the senior design associate at Hurdzan Fry, Jason is largely credited with the final layout of The Georgian Bay Club. In addition to his family life, Jason teaches a 5-hour class on golf course design at The Ohio State University and has lectured on golf course design at Purdue, Guelph, Cornell and the University of Idaho. Being short-listed to Golf Digest's prestigious list of the 40 most influential people in golf under the age of 40 came as no surprise to Dr. Hurdzan, who described Jason as "the epitome of the bright, young superstars of golf course design who is not only artistic, creative and techno savvy, but is also a fabulous communicator and teacher".



## DESIGN

The design mandate from the Club's owners was to provide a Member friendly, playable golf course. That's not to say the course wasn't to have its challenges, and it does. The design intent of the course is to allow Members of all abilities to enjoy the course if they play intelligently and even conservatively when needed.

Generally, the golfer will find wide fairways allowing marginal shots to be found and played again. But don't let the spacious fairways fool you. The angles of the greens dictate preferred sides of the fairways and those positions are carefully protected with natural and man made hazards. Read the hole-by-hole descriptions under "Golf Course" and then "Golf Course Tour" and you will come to know what I mean. The wide fairways are a throwback to an older style of design, one The Georgian Bay Club is making new again.

Speaking of an older design style coming back into fashion... is The Georgian Bay Club's bunkering. Other than the views of Georgian Bay and The Blue Mountains, the bunkering style commands the most attention and is uniquely attractive. The style you see is most associated with famed golf course architect Alister MacKenzie. This style of bunkering was chosen after countless hours of research and is big and dramatic in nature to fit in with the 'oversized' views off the course. We've found pictures of this very style dating back as far as 1908. You will find similar bunkering at notable courses such as Cypress Point, San Francisco Golf Club, the original designs at Augusta National and Merion, Riviera and Pasatiempo, among others.

The bunkers are intended to be a hazard as defined by the rules of golf and are not intended to be easier to play from than the rough, as is often the case for professional tours. The capes and bays of the bunker may in fact allow for an easy recovery one time and a very difficult one the next, with the margin between the two perhaps only a few feet. Being a hazard, the golfer must learn to accept what he or she gets...sometimes very difficult and other times more forgiving. We, as North American golfers, have gotten away from that thinking. So, while the fairways are wide and generous, the bunkering isn't necessarily so. This style and placement of bunkering brings back the thinking and risk/reward element to The Georgian Bay Club, which often lacks on many modern designs. Enjoy the challenge.

AS A COURTESY TO ALL CLUB MEMBERS AND YOUR FELLOW GOLFERS, WE RESPECTFULLY REQUEST ALL GUESTS TO BE AWARE OF, AND ABIDE BY, THE CLUB'S POLICIES AND PROCEDURES. BY ENSURING ALL GUESTS ARE AWARE OF THE CLUB'S POLICIES AND PROCEDURES, WE CAN ENSURE AN ENJOYABLE DAY FOR ALL.

### **GOLFING ABILITY AND PACE OF PLAY**

GOLFERS OF ALL ABILITIES ARE INVITED TO PLAY THE GEORGIAN BAY CLUB, RECOGNIZING WE ARE A CHALLENGING GOLF COURSE THAT CAN AT TIMES BE DIFFICULT FOR SOME NOVICE GOLFERS. MEMBERS ARE ASKED TO ENSURE ALL GUESTS UNDERSTAND AND HAVE AN APPRECIATION FOR THE ETIQUETTE, TRADITIONS, AND BASIC RULES ASSOCIATED WITH THE GREAT GAME OF GOLF, AND ARE AWARE OF THE PACE OF PLAY EXPECTATIONS ON THE COURSE. THE GEORGIAN BAY CLUB MAY BE PLAYED BY GOLFERS OF ALL ABILITIES IN 4 HOURS AND 20 MINUTES OR LESS.

### **CHECK-IN/BAG DROP AREA**

WE ASK ALL GUESTS TO CHECK IN AT LEAST ONE HOUR PRIOR TO THEIR TEE TIME. THE BAG DROP AREA IS LOCATED AT THE FAR END OF THE ROUNDABOUT IN FRONT OF THE CLUBHOUSE. WE ASK ALL VISITING GOLFERS TO PLEASE DROP THEIR GOLF CLUBS AT THE BAG DROP AREA BEFORE PROCEEDING BACK TO THE PARKING LOT. THERE WILL BE AN ATTENDANT SERVICING GUESTS AT THE BAG DROP AREA WHO CAN ASSIST WITH DIRECTIONS TO THE LOCKER ROOMS, GOLF SHOP, DINING FACILITIES, ETC.

### **FOOTWEAR**

THE GEORGIAN BAY CLUB IS A SOFT SPIKE ONLY FACILITY. SOFT SPIKE SHOES MAY BE WORN IN ALL AREAS OF THE CLUBHOUSE. METAL SPIKES ARE NOT PERMITTED ANYWHERE ON CLUB PROPERTY. GOLF SANDALS WITH THE APPROPRIATE SPIKES MAY BE WORN.

IN AN EFFORT TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF POA AND KEEP OUR COURSE IN EXCELLENT CONDITION, WE ASK OUR MEMBERS TO DESIGNATE GOLF SHOES FOR USE ONLY AT THE GEORGIAN BAY CLUB. WE ASK ALL GUESTS TO THOROUGHLY CLEAN THEIR GOLF SHOES PRIOR TO PLAY BY USING THE BRUSHES WE SUPPLY, OR ALLOWING SUFFICIENT TIME FOR OUR LOCKER ROOM TEAM TO THOROUGHLY CLEAN THEIR GOLF SHOES.

### **PRACTICE FACILITIES**

THE CLUB FEATURES A DOUBLE ENDED PRACTICE RANGE WITH OVER TWO ACRES OF TEE DECKS AND SIX TARGET GREENS. OUR SHORT GAME AREA (ADJACENT TO THE PRACTICE RANGE AND GOLF ACADEMY) FEATURES A 4,200 SQUARE-FOOT PRACTICE GREEN, A COURSE CHARACTERISTIC PRACTICE BUNKER, AND CHIPPING AND PITCHING AREAS, ALL DESIGNED TO PREPARE PLAYERS FOR THE ACTUAL COURSE EXPERIENCE. A SEPARATE 5,000 SQUARE-FOOT PUTTING GREEN IS LOCATED ADJACENT TO THE PRACTICE RANGE. IN ADDITION, THERE IS A 7,000 SQUARE-FOOT PUTTING GREEN OVERLOOKING THE EIGHTEENTH FAIRWAY AND MAGNIFICENT GEORGIAN BAY, ADJACENT TO THE GOLF SHOP BY THE FIRST TEE. WE ASK ALL MEMBERS AND GUESTS TO PLEASE REGISTER IN THE GOLF SHOP BEFORE USING THE CLUB'S PRACTICE FACILITIES, TO CONFIRM THEIR ARRIVAL AND TEE TIME, AND TO ENSURE WE MAY SERVE THEM PROPERLY THROUGHOUT THE DAY.

## **WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICES**

THE CLUB RECOGNIZES THAT WIRELESS COMMUNICATION DEVICES (WCD'S) ARE VERY MUCH A PART OF EVERYONE'S LIVES. AT ALL TIMES CELLULAR PHONE USE OR EQUIVALENT SHALL NOT INTERFERE WITH THE QUIET ENJOYMENT OF OTHER MEMBERS AND THEIR GUESTS ON THE GOLF COURSE, AT THE PRACTICE FACILITIES, AND AT THE CLUBHOUSE.

## **CLUB STYLE CODE**

THE WAY WE DRESS REFLECTS DIRECTLY ON THE IMAGE OF THE GEORGIAN BAY CLUB. WE RECOGNIZE AND APPRECIATE THE GAME OF GOLF IS STEEPED IN TRADITION, AND WE WISH TO HONOUR THAT BY OUR DRESS OR 'STYLE' GUIDELINES AND CODE.

THE GOLF SHOP AND PGA AND LPGA TOURS TEND TO REFLECT WHAT IS DEEMED APPROPRIATE GOLF ATTIRE. CURRENT STYLES AND TRENDS LEAN MORE TOWARDS FASHION AND COMFORT. AS A GUIDELINE FOR MEN, GOLF OR DRESS SLACKS, BERMUDA LENGTH SHORTS, MOCK NECK SHIRTS, GOLF SHIRTS AND TAILORED SHIRTS ARE WELCOME; FOR LADIES, GOLF SKORTS OR SHORTS, DRESS SHORTS OR SLACKS, GOLF SHIRTS, BLOUSES AND GOLF SKIRTS AND CAPRI PANTS ARE ACCEPTABLE. CARGO PANTS/SHORTS, SPANDEX AND OTHER TIGHT FITTING GARMENTS SUCH AS BICYCLE WEAR DO NOT MEET OUR STYLE CODE. CARGO PANTS/SHORTS WITH EXTERIOR POCKETS DO NOT MEET OUR STYLE CODE.

IN HONOUR OF OUR RELAXED ATMOSPHERE, PROPERLY TAILORED AND FITTING JEAN PANTS ARE ALLOWED IN THE CLUBHOUSE, BUT NEVER ON THE GOLF COURSE OR PRACTICE FACILITIES, INCLUDING THE DRIVING RANGE, SHORT GAME AREA, AND PRACTICE GREENS.

MEMBERS ARE ASKED TO INFORM THEIR GUESTS OF OUR CLUB'S STYLE CODE TO AVOID ANY POSSIBLE EMBARRASSMENT. THE CLUB'S STYLE CODE ALSO APPLIES TO ANY CHILDREN.

GENTLEMEN ARE ASKED TO REMOVE HATS WHILE SEATED IN THE INDOOR DINING AREAS OF THE CLUBHOUSE. PLEASE ASK THE GOLF SHOP STAFF FOR MORE INFORMATION IF YOU ARE UNSURE OF WHAT IS ACCEPTABLE.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #1 (PAR 4)



The opening hole is a solid dogleg left with a 60' deep ravine running the entire left side. From the tee, there is a large fairway bunker guarding the landing area on the right side of the fairway. This hole is a great opening challenge and features one of the smallest greens on the course. The approach shot to the long, narrow green is more favourable from the right side of the fairway, as the approach from the left near the ravine brings the greenside bunker into play. Simply a great opening hole!

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #2 (PAR 4)



This hole epitomizes the golf course as a "second shot" golf course. With a wide landing area, this short Par 4 allows a selection of clubs off the tee. A tee shot to the left centre of the fairway puts you in great position to see the pin and think about getting it close, but requires the greatest risk off the tee. The approach shot from the right is more challenging with the green protected by a deep bunker in the front right of the green.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #3 (PAR 3)



All one can really say is WOW! This Par 3 strategically preserved an old gravel quarry with the green positioned on a bluff falling off on three sides. The spectacular view of Georgian Bay rivals anything the golfing world has to offer. The drop in elevation, the direction of the wind, and the greenside bunkers all make your club selection the key for success. A pin in the back left is the most daunting to reach, and a tee shot to the center of the green is always a great play.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #4 (PAR 4)



This dogleg right Par 4 has a deep ravine running the length of the tee shot right, which then cuts in between the generous landing area and the green. You may be tempted to risk a right centre tee shot to reduce the approach shot by as many as three clubs. The approach shot over the ravine usually requires a half club extra to ensure your ball stays up and on the false front of the green. It is all about your strategy off the tee for your second shot that defines this challenging hole.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #5 (PAR 3)



This is the longest Par 3 on the course, with the design characteristics of the green complex reflecting the challenges of an otherwise straight forward hole. The green is set at an angle to the tee and it is easy to come up short right in the catcher's mitt or run all the way through to the bunkers on the back left or back right. The variety of pin placements on this undulating green and the wind of the day provide for a new strategy every time you tee it up.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #6 (PAR 4)



This straight away Par 4 presents an illusion of length because behind the green in the distance is the pond on #7 followed by the 7th fairway. This lack of context behind the green gives you the impression of distance, adding further to the psychology of this strong Par 4. The approach shot leaves you facing a pond to the left and back of the green, and a large swale to catch any ball on the right edge of the green. Middle of the green and a two putt Par is always a good score.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #7 (PAR 5)



This dogleg right is the first and only Par 5 on the front and is a classic hole of heroic design. For those who can carry their tee shot over the furthest corner of the pond to the right, you will have a great chance of catching the down slope and shortening the hole. The longer the carry off the tee, the greater the reward for those with the horsepower to get home in two. It is a heroic risk reward hole of grand proportions, but sometimes the conservative play will yield more birdie chances.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #8 (PAR 4)



This is a wonderful Par 4 dogleg left with a strong risk reward strategy off the tee. Playing to a point between the creek on the right and the diagonal bunker complex on the left will leave a long iron into the green. The temptation will be to cut the left corner, which will undoubtedly leave a shorter approach, but also leaves a much more difficult angle over a deep and twisting bunker complex guarding the front left of the green.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #9 (PAR 4)



The home hole on the front nine is a straight away Par 4 framed by two ridges of waving fescue on either side with a fairway bunker on the right side. The green is angled from front right to back left, inviting a tee shot to be placed near the lone fairway bunker. From there it is a short or mid iron to an open green on the front right guarded by bunkers on both sides. Be sure to make note of any wind and the slightly elevated green when making your club selection.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #10 (PAR 4)



With a large fairway, don't let this Par 4 lull you into a sense of complacency. You want to focus on the preferred side of the fairway based on the pin position. The front right of the green is open, but the greenside bunker and swale are ready to catch leaking shots. A back left pin is always challenging to reach from the left side of the fairway. The green is one of the largest greens on the golf course, making a proper club selection for your approach shot all the more important.

A driveable Par 4 with many options off the tee. Many golfers tend to go for it with a driver, but the risks of doing so are numerous. The conservative play is to the main part of the fairway right, which leaves you with a likely wedge to a narrow green with bunkers in front and behind. This crafty Par 4 will yield its share of birdies and maybe even an eagle or two. Select your strategy and be confident in your execution so you don't walk away wondering "how did I just do that?"

The shortest Par 3 can also be one of the most demanding if its challenges are not fully assessed.

Anything short will not bounce up and on, so club selection should be carefully considered.

The green is well bunkered on both sides and there is a steep cliff off the left and rear.

Check the wind carefully before you pull the trigger, as the only margin for error is short of the green.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE # 13 (PAR 5)



The key to this reachable Par 5 is to play it backwards in your mind. The tee shot can be played safely to the wide fairway to the left or you can risk hitting over the fairway bunker on the right for a favourable roll down the sloping fairway. The conservative play is to lay up into the neck of the fairway rather than risk a shot over the huge bunker complex protecting the entire front and right of the green. The approach shots are all to an elevated and undulating green which measures over 10,000 square feet, with a cliff running up to and beside the entire left side of the hole. It is important to protect against the challenge of a long putt, so know your yardage for proper club selection. A par on this hole may sometimes leave you feeling you have dropped a stroke to the field, but don't let a less than perfect tee shot lead to a score you could have avoided by adjusting your strategy.

# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #14 (PAR 4)



The tee shot on this sharp dogleg right Par 4 competes for the most dramatic on the course. Pay attention to the wind if you are going to cut the corner to avoid the fairway bunkers; however, an overly aggressive tee shot hit too far will flirt with the pond on the far side of the fairway. A tee shot to the wider left side of the fairway, while safer, will leave a much longer approach shot into a long green running from back to front, bringing the left greenside bunker and pond into play.

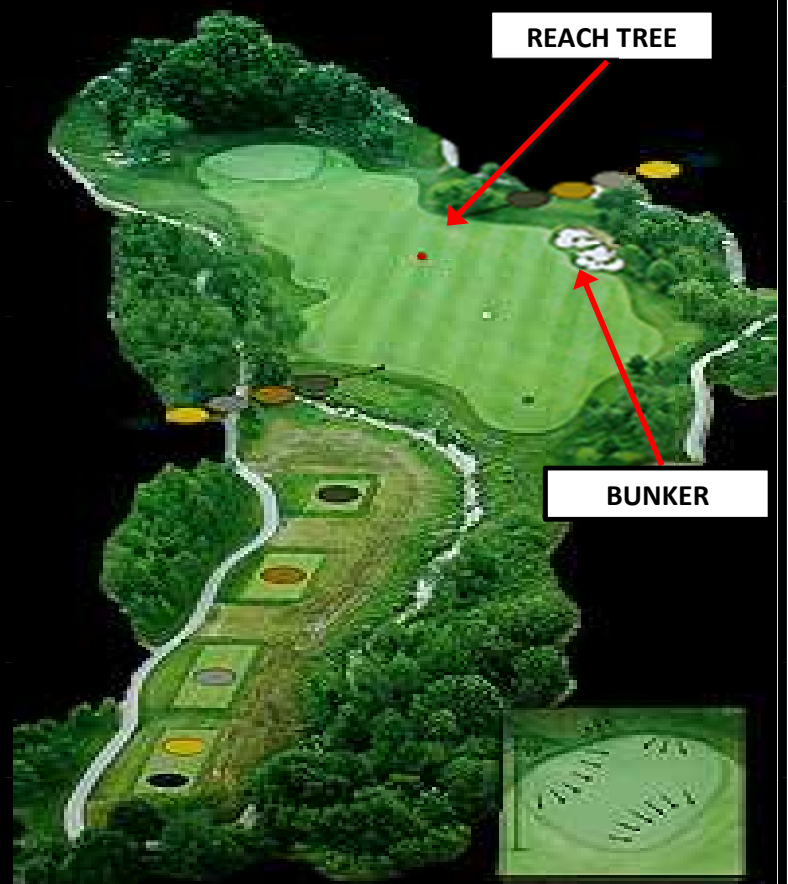
# GEORGIAN BAY CLUB - HOLE #15 (PAR 4)



This medium length Par 4 provides a bit of a breather before the demanding final 3 holes. Be confident and trust your yardage on your approach shot. There are no greenside bunkers on this hole with the green situated in a bowl-like setting rising from front to back and protected by a false side on the right and a large ridge on the left. Reading the green is the key to a good score, so be sure to pay attention on your first putt and don't let the green get the best of you.

The green favours an approach shot from the left side of the fairway, and is bunkered on both sides. Walking away with Par on this hole is always a great score.

The home hole is truly a classic 3-Shot Par 5 in a majestic setting. Playing 600+ yards and climbing 30 feet in elevation, a solid tee shot is needed for position to carry the deep creek on your 2nd. A less than perfect tee shot requires a decision for whether or not you can carry the creek on the second shot. Provided your 2nd shot finds the fairway, you will have an uphill approach to a large back to front green protected by greenside bunkers front left and back right. A 3rd shot from the right side of the fairway gives you the best views of the green, as well as your fellow Members sitting high atop on the Clubhouse patio. The challenging pin placements on this final green always make for great entertainment for golfers and spectators alike. Truly a great finish to a great day of golf!
