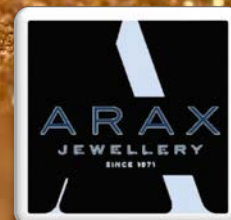

Meadowbrook Golf Club - Guest Play

Guest play is an essential element to the success of our club. Meadowbrook members are encouraged to bring many guests to enjoy the club, but a guest is only permitted to play the course a maximum of 5 times per season. If you are bringing a guest to the club for the first time, we have provided a listing below of best practices and directives to help ensure an enjoyable experience for all.

Attire - The dress code of the Club provides for the appropriate dress required in the various areas of the Clubhouse and the Golf Course as would be expected in a private golf club environment. Standards of dress apply at all times for all Members and their Guests, and this standard dictates that “jeans” of any colour are not permitted on the Golf Course, and only "Smart Denim" (not ripped, frayed, distressed, torn or faded) is allowed in the Clubhouse. Caps must be worn with the peaks forward, and shirts must be tucked in at all times except those that are designed to be worn out.

Mobile Devices - The use of cell phones and other Personal Electronic Devices (laptop computers, smartphones, etc.) is prohibited in all parts of the Clubhouse with the exception of the Lower Lounge. The Lower Lounge is now designated as a “business-friendly” area, and all Personal Electronic Devices may be activated in that area only.

While on the golf course, all wireless communication devices must be set to silent or vibrate mode and conversations kept to a minimum so as not to affect the pace of play.

Please note that guests are governed by the same attire and conduct standards by which a member is governed. Members are completely responsible for all guests he or she brings to the Club.



2.1 DRESS CODE - MEMBERS AND GUESTS GENERAL

The dress code of the club provides for appropriate neat, tailored attire required in various areas of the Clubhouse and on the Golf Course, as would be expected in a private golf Club environment, and in keeping with traditions of the game. Standards of dress apply at all times for all members and their guests. Athletic or workout wear is not permitted.

SHIRTS Men:

- Suitable golf shirts must have sleeves, with a collar, blade collar, mock or turtleneck.
- Golf shirts may be worn outside of slacks or shorts only if designed as such, are fully banded at the bottom, and of reasonable length.
- Narrow-band T-shirts or tank tops are prohibited both on the Golf Course and in the Clubhouse.

Women:

- Suitable golf shirts must have either a collar or sleeves.
- Turtlenecks or mock necks may be worn.
- Golf shirts may be worn outside of slacks or shorts only if designed as such, are fully banded at the bottom, and of reasonable length.
- Narrow-band T-shirts, tank or halter tops, and bare midriffs are prohibited both on the Golf Course and in the Clubhouse.

PANTS/SHORTS – Men:

- Golf slacks and shorts, including those with multiple pockets (not Cargo), must be tailored.
- Shorts must be no shorter than mid-thigh in length when standing.
- Sweatpants, tracksuits, cut-offs & gym shorts are not permitted.

PANTS/SHORTS/SKIRTS/SKORTS – Women:

- Golf slacks and shorts, including those with multiple pockets (not Cargo), must be tailored.
- Capri pants are allowed.
- Shorts, skirts & skorts must be no shorter than mid-thigh in length when standing.
- Sweat pants, track suits, stirrup pants, cut-offs & gym shorts are not permitted.

SOCKS/SHOES

- Spikeless or soft-spiked footwear to be worn on the golf course and practice facilities. Leisure shoes with soft soles are also permitted.
- Flip-flops are not permitted anywhere on the property except in locker rooms.
- A choice of sockettes, ankle socks, or executive-length knee socks may be worn.
- Golf sandals may be worn with or without socks.
- Sandals may be worn without socks in all areas of the Clubhouse.

HATS

- Caps must be worn with the peaks forward.
- Caps and Hats may be worn only on the lower level of the Clubhouse and on the Upper Patio.

DENIM

- Smart Denim is considered to be not ripped, frayed, distressed, torn, or faded.
- Smart Denim pants, skirts, and dresses may be worn in the Clubhouse and on the adjacent patios.
- Smart Denim is not allowed on the Golf Course or any practice area.
- Denim jackets are not allowed at any time on the Golf Course or in the Clubhouse.
- Specific events may be designated as “No Smart Denim”.

ADVERTISING ON CLOTHING

- Discreet commercial cresting (e.g. Beer Companies, Sports Franchises) is permitted on golf shirts and caps.
- Advertising must be in good taste and must not exceed 2 inches in width and 2 inches in height.
- There is no restriction on golf manufacturer cresting, provided that it does not overwhelm the garment.
- There is no restriction on garments with the Meadowbrook crest.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

This information supplements the 2026 Local Rules and Terms of Conditions for the GTA AM Tour. The current issue of the Golf Canada Rules of Golf govern play. **Any rules on the host club scorecard do not apply. Penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the general penalty, unless otherwise noted.**

1. **OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 18.2):** See GTA AM Tour Hard Card for how Out of Bounds is defined.

The driving range between holes #8 and #9 is out of bounds. The boundary on these holes is defined by the course side edge of the poles holding the netting. The poles and netting are boundary objects and the player may NOT receive free relief under Rule 16.

The support wires on the course side of the poles are immovable obstructions and the player may receive relief under Rule 16.

The practice holes to the right of hole #9 is out of bounds. The boundary is defined by white stakes or white lines.

2. **HOST CLUB DROP ZONES ARE NOT AVAILABLE:** Any Drop Zone available at this event will be indicated by a GTA AM Tour sign.
3. **PENALTY AREAS (Rule 17):** Red and yellow lines define the edge of the penalty area. Where penalty areas are not marked with lines, the change in the height of the grass defines the edge of the penalty area. Where there is no change in the height of the grass, the penalty area is defined by its natural boundaries. Unmarked penalty areas are red penalty areas.
4. **HOLE #1 PROTECTIVE NETTING / SCREEN:** The protective screen on the left side of the 1st hole is an immovable obstruction. If the player has interference with the lie of the ball, stance or the area of intended swing, the ball may be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 16.1
5. **HOLE #5 WASTE AREA:** The sandy area located between the teeing area and the green is a “waste area” and part of the general area.
6. **OBSTRUCTIONS AND GROUND UNDER REPAIR (Rule 16.1 applies):** Any areas of ground under repair will be marked or noted.

NO PLAY ZONES: Areas that are ornamental garden beds, turf nurseries or decorative flowerbeds are No Play Zones that are to be treated as Ground Under Repair. Players must proceed under Rule 16.1f.

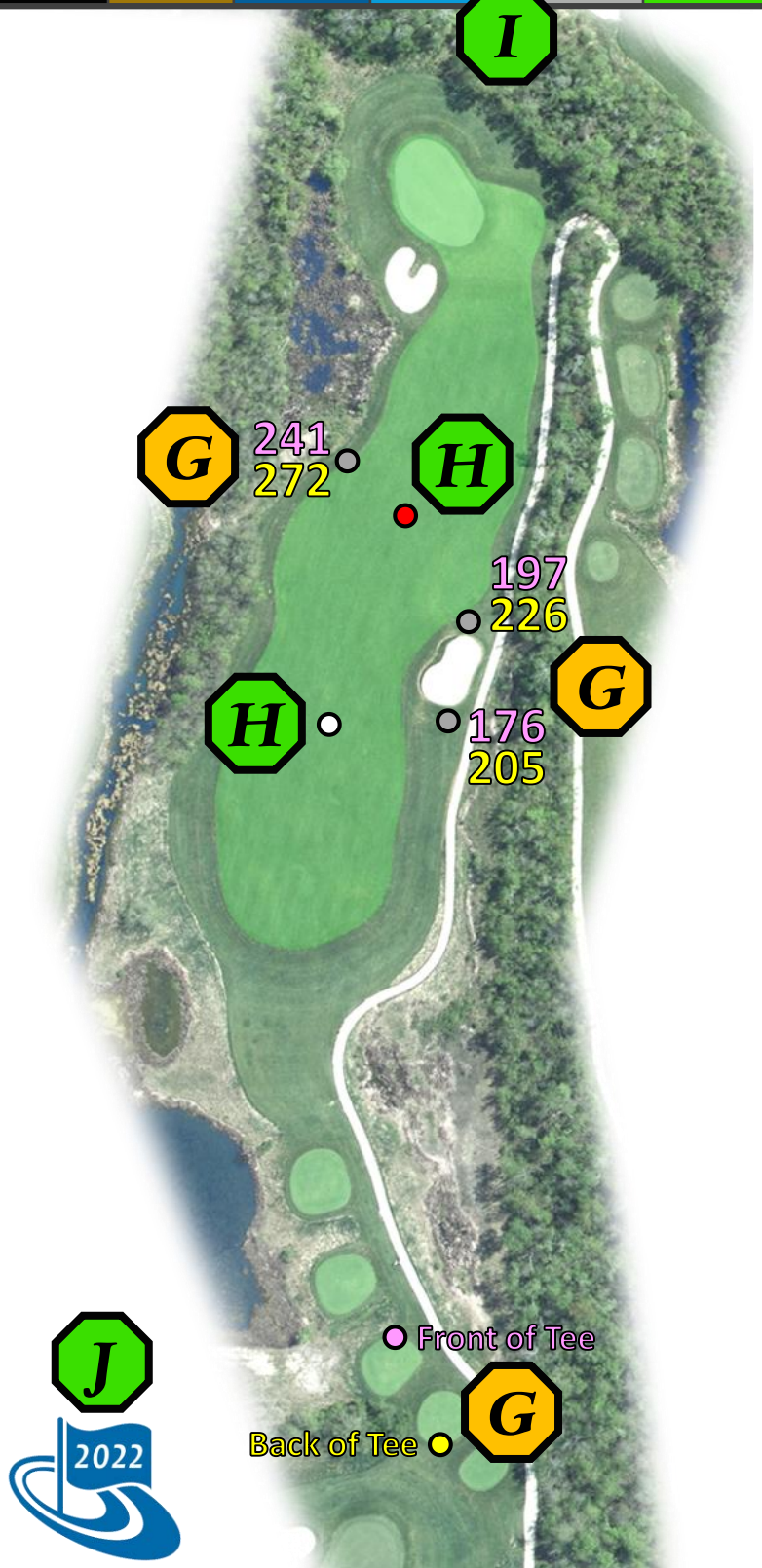

- B. Image of the green complex (aligned to the 150-yard marker).
- C. Flag showing the pin location.
- D. Distances from the front and side of the green to the pin location.
- E. Green depth and a +/- distance from the centre of the green to the pin in brackets.
- F. Arrow indicating the direction to the next tee (leave your clubs here when walking).
- G. Distances from spots in the teeing ground to various locations in the landing area ○. The distance text is colour coded to match the teeing ground spots. The actual tee marker positions will vary, but differences can be quickly paced off or estimated.
- H. Standard 100 ●, 150 ○, 200 ●, and 250 ● yard markers.



- I. Hole yardages for each flight.
- J. Flag indicating the year of photography.

Green Depth = 39 yds (+2)

Welcome to the 2026 ARAX Jewellery Classic

Your round begins with a medium-length dogleg right that requires a good tee shot. This deep green is accessible in front, but challenges players to hit their approach to the correct side of the swale crossing this green. Depending on green speed and pin position, you could find yourself with a difficult 2-putt.



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Hole #2 (Par 5)

Green Depth = 44 yds (-2)

The only Par 5 on the front nine plays uphill off the tee with the shortest line to the green, guarded by fairway bunkers with steep lips. Keep your second shot to the right side of the fairway to guarantee an unchallenged approach into this relatively flat green.



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Hole #3 (Par 3)

Green Depth = 31 yds (-9)

Statistically recorded as the easiest hole on the course, the "Signature Hole" at Meadowbrook offers a stunning tee shot over a large pond into a wide but shallow green. A bailout area short and right is open for the faint of heart. Birdies can be had on this hole!

Green Depth = 37 yds (-7)

Either play it 'safe' or go big.
The risky player will challenge the snaking Brook, leaving themselves with less than 130 yards into this elevated green. Those playing it safe will carefully layup to a landing area short of the Brook and a guaranteed approach shot of at least 150 yards. This hole is pointed into the prevailing wind, forcing a different decision off the tee each time it is played.



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Hole #5 (Par 3)

Green Depth = 31 yds (+6)

The second Par 3 on the front nine is the hardest Par 3 on the course. The tee is elevated, with the green guarded by multiple steep bunkers on all sides.

Take enough club on this hole to stay out of trouble. If you miss the green, pat yourself on the back if you get up and down!

Green Depth = 32 yds (+3)

Often considered one of the most challenging holes at Meadowbrook, this Par 4 requires two well-executed shots to reach an elevated, backstopped green that is unforgiving. The steep surface can result in players putting off the green if they aren't cautious. Achieving par on this hole is an impressive feat!

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Hole #7 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 40 yds (+9)

This straightaway Par 4 requires a tee shot down the left centre to avoid the fairway bunkers. Your 2nd shot plays downhill from the landing area into a deep green with an open area in front. This is your opportunity to gain back a stroke before facing another tough Par 4 at #8.



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Hole #8 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 38 yds (-9)

This dogleg left Par 4 will reward longer hitters, as balls landing in the fairway will follow the steep slope and gain valuable yards. A well-placed shot to the knoll to the left of the green will kick all approach shots to the middle of the green safely. Par is a good score on this hole!



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Hole #9 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 32 yds (0)

This dogleg right Par 4 demands a tee shot placed down the left side of the fairway to avoid the multiple mature trees guarding the right side of this hole.

If your tee shot was successful, a receptive green offers the player a chance to mark down a birdie on their scorecard.

Green Depth = 25 yds (+6)

The opening hole on the back nine offers a straightforward tee shot where staying short of the fairway bunker is key. A wide green invites approach shots with mowed collection areas short and long. Despite its length, Par is a good score.

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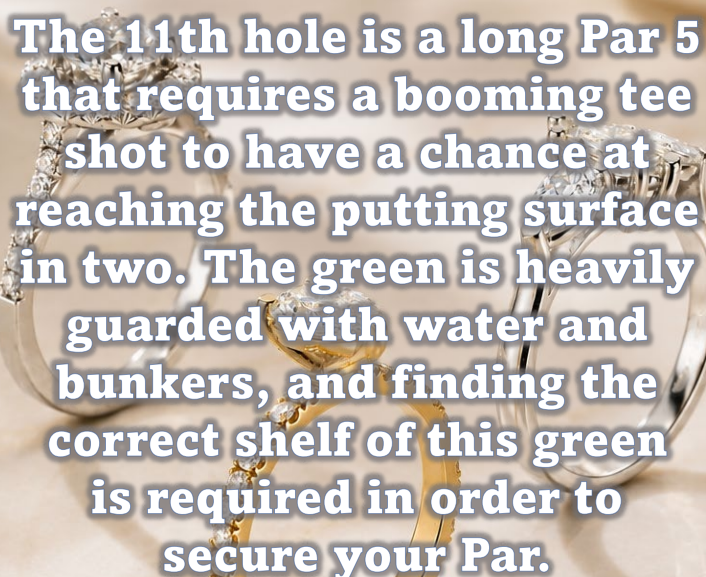
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Hole #11 (Par 5)

Green Depth = 35 yds (-8)



The 11th hole is a long Par 5 that requires a booming tee shot to have a chance at reaching the putting surface in two. The green is heavily guarded with water and bunkers, and finding the correct shelf of this green is required in order to secure your Par.

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Hole #12 (Par 3)

Green Depth = 39 yds (+9)

This pretty Par 3 offers plenty of bailout right and long, but anything short requires scuba gear for your 2nd shot. Cast your tee shot over the water and attack this pin for a low number. There is still time to finish strong, so a Par here is a good score, but a Birdie would be better!



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Hole #13 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 35 yds (-2)

This Par 4 demands your utmost focus with a tight landing area off the tee and a forced carry into the green. Most players will have at least 150 yards into this elevated green, so choose your club wisely. Find the middle of the green to avoid a tricky up-and-down.



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Hole #14 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 38 yds (+8)

This Par 4 favours tee shots played to the left side of the fairway, making the long approach easier into this deep surface. The elevated green is protected by bunkers left and right, and multiple undulations in the surface will require a deft touch with the flat stick.

Green Depth = 40 yds (+5)

The 15th hole follows the natural rise of the land to a green situated at the highest point on the property. Players are faced with a challenging shot into the green, as the putting surface is not visible from the fairway. Adjusting your yardage is key to hitting your approach pin high.



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Hole #16 (Par 3)

Green Depth = 36 yds (-2)

This long Par 3 appears to play downhill to a left-to-right sloped surface. Tee shots landing short of the green have little chance of making the surface, so make sure to take enough club. Players aiming for the middle of the green will escape with their Par, or maybe even a Birdie!



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Hole #17 (Par 5)

Green Depth = 38 yds (+3)

A 550/515-yard Par 5 opens with a blind shot to a wide fairway, so aim between the trees and trust your swing! Most players will hit their second shot downhill towards the Brook before a forced carry into a backstopped green with plenty of room to chase the ball into the green. Watch out for a back pin placement, as any ball coming to rest above the pin can quickly add a few extra strokes to your card.



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Hole #18 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 38 yds (-13)

The final hole demands a precisely placed tee shot aimed at the right center of the fairway to steer clear of the low-hanging branches of a 60+-year-old oak tree at the end of the fairway.

The deep green features subtle undulations, providing players with a great opportunity to record a low score before signing their scorecard!



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
