NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

This information supplements the 2023 Local Rules and Terms of Conditions for the GTA AM Tour. The current issue of the Golf Canada Rules of Golf govern play. **Any rules on the host club scorecard do not apply. Penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the general penalty, unless otherwise noted.**

1. **OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 18.2):** See GTA AM Tour Hard Card for how Out of Bounds is defined.
2. **HOST CLUB DROP ZONES ARE NOT AVAILABLE:** Any Drop Zone available at this event will be indicated by a GTA AM Tour sign.
3. **PENALTY AREAS (Rule 17):** Red and yellow lines define the edge of the penalty area. Where penalty areas are not marked with lines, the change in the height of the grass defines the edge of the penalty area. Where there is no change in the height of the grass, the penalty area is defined by its natural boundaries. Unmarked penalty areas are red penalty areas.

NO PLAY ZONES ON HOLES 11, 12 and 13: These areas are marked with red/yellow stakes with green tops. Entry or play beyond these green-topped stakes is strictly prohibited. For balls known to be beyond these stakes, a player must proceed in accordance with an applicable option under Rule 17.1.

HOLE #11 (right side): Beyond these red green-topped stakes is a gorge that presents a serious safety risk.

HOLE #12 & #13: River below the 12th tee and along on the entire left side of 13th hole.

4. **OBSTRUCTIONS AND GROUND UNDER REPAIR (Rule 16.1 applies):** Any areas of ground under repair will be marked or noted.

NO PLAY ZONES: Areas that are ornamental garden beds, turf nurseries or decorative flowerbeds are No Play Zones that are to be treated as Ground Under Repair. Player must proceed under Rule 16.1

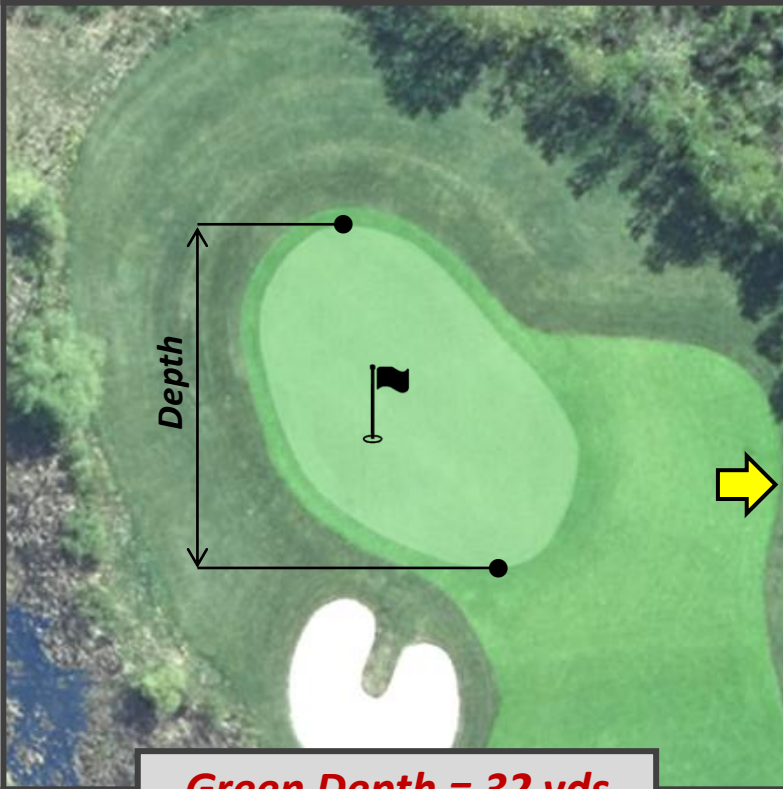
PERMANENT FANS near putting greens may be close to or on a player's line of play. In addition to relief for interference for lie of the ball, stance or area of intended swing, a player whose ball is in such a position that the fan intervenes on his line of play may drop the ball, without penalty, not nearer the hole in an area that avoids the intervention on the line of play.

5. **STAY BACK FROM CLIFF EDGES. THESE AREAS POSE A SERIOUS SAFETY RISK.**

How To Use This Guide

Hole #6 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 32 yds

On the left side of the page, you will see the hole number and par. The square image shows the green complex (aligned to the 150-yard marker) with the pin location for the event.

The green depth is also shown. A yellow arrow indicates the direction to the next tee (leave your clubs here when walking).

This box provides pro tips and general information about the hole.

On the right side, the yardages for each flight are shown. The hole image indicates distances from spots in the teeing ground ●●● to various locations in the landing area ○. The distance text is colour coded to match the teeing ground spots. The actual tee marker positions will vary, but differences can be quickly paced off or estimated. Standard 100 ●, 150 ○, 200 ●, and 250 ● yard markers may also be shown.



Hole #1 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 26 yds

This seemingly friendly opener, downhill and often downwind, is more challenging than it appears. A wayward tee shot is likely to find tree trouble on either side. Length off the tee is often rewarded with a flat lie and a much shorter approach thanks to the down slope. The mid-sized green can be tricky to hold and is protected by two large bunkers right and a collection area left.

Member's Bounce:
The approach can play one club shorter downwind.

Green Depth = 25 yds

For most, this Par 5 plays the longest of any at Whitevale, particularly with a North wind. That said, long hitters can sneak their tee shot past the first fairway bunker and have a go at the green in two. For the rest of us, favouring the left side all the way is the smart play.

Member's Bounce:

If you miss your tee shot into the valley, right, don't be tempted into a low-percentage shot over (or through) the trees.

Green Depth = 28 yds

Every great course should have a challenging short Par 4. Whitevale has two of them, and this is the first. A tee shot that carries the gorge and bunker can leave an approach inside 100 yards, but don't miss left or you're in for an exhausting ball search. The tricky green is as difficult to hold as it is to putt and is guarded by trouble on either side.

Member's Bounce:
Putts toward the front of the green are more uphill than they appear.



Hole #4 (Par 3)

Green Depth = 28 yds

What a view! Whitevale's signature hole is one of the most breathtaking holes in Southern Ontario. For a Par-3, it's also a fantastic risk/reward hole. The strategy will dictate club selection. The green is on a 45-degree angle, so a purposeful shot to the right generally requires two more clubs than a bailout left.

Member's Bounce:
Take less club for the bailout or you'll be faced with a difficult chip from long left.



Hole #5 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 22 yds

Although there's ample room right, out-of-bounds down the entire left side is more in play than it may appear. This is the first of several Par 4's at Whitevale, where the further your drive, the more the fairway narrows. Unless you think you're Bryson, your approach will be partially blind with the green tucked 20 feet below the fairway. The 40-foot-high birdhouse is your target.

Member's Bounce:
On your approach, don't be long. And don't be left.

Green Depth = 24 yds

Nothing blind about this classic Par 4. On the tee, consider the pin position. From the left fairway, a left pin can be blocked out by the venerable tree canopy but beware of the pond on the right. The large two-tiered green will reward you for hitting the proper side with your approach.

Member's Bounce:
It's much easier to get up and down from short or right of the green.



Hole #7 (Par 5)

Green Depth = 28 yds

Another fantastic view, particularly from the tips. Long drivers who take on the imposing fairway bunker can easily reach this Par 5 in two.

If you're laying up, note the pin position to afford the best angle for your wedge. One of the few flat(ish) greens at Whitevale. Birdie time!

Member's Bounce:

For your approach, the bunker on the right is 40 yards short of the green, and there is more bailout room right than you can see.



Hole #8 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 32 yds

One of our best and toughest Par 4s. Lots to think about here. A well-placed drive is essential, but your line off the tee depends on how far you intend to hit it. The further your tee shot, the narrower the fairway. Prudence off the tee translates to a more challenging approach to a narrow, elevated green.

Member's Bounce:

The green's false front means don't be short on your approach and don't be long on putts to a front pin.



Hole #9 (Par 3)

Green Depth = 28 yds

Toughest Par 3 at Whitevale (and some say the toughest Par period). From all five tee blocks, the hole plays longer than its yardage, even if there's no wind in your face. Ominous bunkers gobble almost every shot that comes up short. If you're going to miss the green (and most do) it's generally a little better to miss right.

Member's Bounce:
Whitevale is known for some severe greens, and this is one of them ... keep your ball below the hole!

Green Depth = 29 yds

The first of 4 holes on the back-9 where the entire hole is visible from the tee. Again, there are strategic options: long down the right side provides a shorter approach, but short of the fairway bunker gives you a much nicer view of the green for your 2nd shot. The large undulating green calls for imagination on chips and putts.

Member's Bounce:

Be sure to get your approach on the pin side of the green's centre hump.

Green Depth = 35 yds

A unique golf hole, the 11th, flows downhill, hugging the gorge's edge on the right, then makes a dramatic left turn uphill to a large, well-bunkered green. This may be your most crucial tee shot of the day. Hit a good one, and you'll likely funnel down to the 100-yard marker.

Member's Bounce:

If you've got the horsepower, take dead aim over the gorge to widen your landing area.

Green Depth = 30 yds

This is the GTA Am Tour Hole In One Competition!

The shortest and perhaps most beautiful hole on the course. While there's lots of trouble down there, including the rippling waters of Duffin's Creek, focus instead on the opportunity - this hole yields the most holes-in-one every season. A massive green with significant undulation will test your lag putting.

Member's Bounce:

Pick your club carefully and make sure you adjust for both the elevation and the wind.



Hole #13 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 31 yds

Your beautiful journey along (and over) Duffin's Creek continues with a great, short Par-4. From the tee, the creek should be the least of your worries as dense forest guards both sides of a fairway, narrowing significantly the further your tee shot goes. The one bunker on this hole is a doozy and must be avoided.

Member's Bounce:

Thanks to the red stakes, the penalty for a lost ball is less severe on the left side.



Hole #14 (Par 3)

Green Depth = 35 yds

A completely different Par 3, but just as challenging. Club selection from the sheltered tee deck can be difficult and vary considerably depending on the pin position. Lots of humps to navigate on this massive green, but the predominant slope is back right to front left. Take dead aim!

*Member's Bounce:
Don't mess with the hazard left;
there's more room right
then you can see.*



Hole #15 (Par 4)

Green Depth = 32 yds

This difficult Par 4 starts an exhilarating home stretch that is long and mostly uphill, yet not without scoring opportunities. #15 presents perhaps the toughest tee shot of the day. Steer clear of the sizeable penal fairway bunker that will swallow even a modest leak to the right. Consider the wind on your approach, even if you can't feel it.

Member's Bounce:

For your target off the tee, pick a tree left of the centre to avoid the fairway bunker.



Hole #16 (Par 5)

Green Depth = 24 yds

Whitevale's shortest Par 5 winds uphill around the deepest bunkers on the course. Once again, there are decisions to make from the tee. Depending on the result, taking on the cavernous fairway bunkers can be a two-shot swing. Another yawning trap at the 100-yard marker ensures that even layup shots are not boring.

Member's Bounce:
Take an extra club on your approach, but be careful, out-of-bounds lurks behind the green!



Hole #17 (Par 5)

Green Depth = 27 yds

The second of back-to-back Par 5's, but this one plays entirely differently. Downhill all the way with plenty of room to grip it and rip it. Life gets more stressful on the approach with a lurking pond surrounded by a closely mown slope. Most layups will run hard to the right bringing the pond into play.

Member's Bounce:
Many a good layup has rolled, rolled, rolled, and ... right into the pond. Take less club on your layup, just in case.

Green Depth = 40 yds

A fantastic finishing hole unless you need a birdie. Our home hole is all uphill, affording an unabated view for those on the Clubhouse patio. The lone fairway bunker is one of the most treacherous on the golf course. Take note of the pin position, as this is one of the deepest greens at Whitevale.

*Member's Bounce:
Take dead aim on your approach.
There are worse places to miss
than the greenside bunkers.*
