DRESS CODE

(Revised 2015)

- 1. The Dress Code term “smart casual” should be considered as a minimum standard of dress at the Club at all times. The Dress Code will apply equally to all members and guests regardless of age.**
- 2. Footwear is required at all times in the Clubhouse. Sport sandals such as flip flops or Crocs are not permitted in the Dining Room. Dress sandals for both men and women are permitted in the outdoor service areas of the Clubhouse as well the 19th Hole and Dining Room.**
- 3. Appropriate denim apparel is permitted in the Dining Room, Patio, and the 19th Hole. Cut off jeans, jeans that are torn, ripped, frayed or patched are NOT permitted anywhere on the property. Denim wear of any colour is not permitted at any time on the Golf Course or the Practice Range.**
- 4. See-through shirts, midriff-baring shirts, tank tops, tube tops, halter tops, logo t-shirts (not adhering to the 4-inch rule), jogging/rugby pants, spandex wear, short shorts, tights, yoga pants, or short skirts are not acceptable on the property (including the Practice Range) or in the Clubhouse. Non-LPCC logos are permissible if the logo is smaller than 4” x 4”.**
- 5. Wearing pants or shorts noticeably below waist height is not acceptable.**
- 6. Golf hats, caps, or visors are permitted in the Golf Shop, Patio, 19th Hole and on the Golf Course. All head wear is to be worn as it is intended (bill forward).**

The Club realizes that members use the Club in certain areas while they are in transition. Members are permitted to enter and exit the Club (Clubhouse entrance to locker rooms only) in street attire. Changing from street attire to acceptable Club standard is NOT permitted in the parking lot.

Finally, the Club makes every effort to ensure that all clothing sold in the Golf Shop complies with the Dress Code as amended from time to time. All Management and Staff will make every effort to advise the member or guest when they are in violation of the Dress Code. However, the responsibility for compliance is ultimately the responsibility of the member and not any LPCC Staff or Management.

*** Please remember, that all Members are responsible for guests' attire.**

Golfers Dress Code

- 1. Tailored shorts for men and shorts, skirts, skorts, or golf dresses for women are to be of conservative in length for golf apparel.**
- 2. Pants/Shorts with draw strings and cargo style shorts/pants are not permissible.**
- 3. No denim apparel of any colour is allowed on the Golf Course or Practice Range at any time.**
- 4. Metal spiked golf shoes are not permitted anywhere on the Club's property.**
- 5. Clothing with non-LPCC logos are permissible, if the logo is smaller than 4" x 4".**
- 6. Caps and visors may not be worn backwards at any time.**
- 7. When wearing shorts, socks or sockettes are required with all footwear on the Golf Course except golf sandals, which do not require socks.**

Ladies and Girls

- 1. Sleeveless golf shirts / blouses must have a collar and collarless shirts/blouses must have sleeves.**
- 2. Shirts must be tucked in unless they have been specifically tailored to be worn otherwise.**
- 3. Capri pants and wind suits are acceptable attire.**
- 4. Women's designer golf apparel is allowed.**

Gentlemen and Boys

- 1. Collared golf shirts, turtlenecks, or mock neck shirts with a collar of at least 1½" are acceptable and must be tucked in at all times.**
- 2. Wind suits are acceptable attire.**

Mobile Device Policy

- 1. All mobile and cellular devices are to be switched to silent or vibrate mode while on Club property.**
- 2. Members are expected to use common courtesy when using mobile and cellular devices on the course and in the Clubhouse for email or texting purposes.**
- 3. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES should the use of these devices interfere with the pace of play, the play of other members or the enjoyment of other members and guests.**
- 4. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES is the use of a mobile phone or other electronic device with a camera for any reason permitted in the Locker Rooms.**

LOOKOUT POINT C.C. - HOLE #1 (PAR 4)



Your 1st Hole of the day at Lookout Point is one of the most picturesque holes you will ever play. This tee shot is one of the highest points of the Niagara Escarpment. With an elevated tee shot that drops 130 feet to the green, a good drive will allow the player a mid to low iron approach shot into a green guarded by two bunkers. This hole is a good chance to get your round started with a Par, or maybe even a Birdie!

CLUB CHAMPION TIPS!

KEEP YOUR TEE SHOT LEFT. YOU CAN MISS THE FAIRWAY LEFT WITHOUT GETTING IN TROUBLE, BUT THERE ARE BIG PINE TREES DOWN THE RIGHT THAT FORCE YOU TO PUNCH OUT. GREEN BREAKS AWAY FROM THE CLUBHOUSE, DESPITE HOW IT LOOKS!

LOOKOUT POINT C.C. - HOLE #2 (PAR 3 - HIO)



The 2nd Hole is a 174 yard Par 3. A mid Iron tee shot should get you to the green with two large bunkers protecting the front. The green is severely sloped from left to right. Par is a good score as you move onto Hole #3.

CLUB CHAMPION TIPS!

SHORT PAR 3 WITH SMALL GREEN. EITHER HIT THE GREEN OR LAND SHORT. DO NOT MISS RIGHT OR LONG. GETTING UP AND DOWN FROM THE LEFT OR SHORT IS A GOOD OPTION.

Hole #3 at Lookout Point is a reachable Par 5 where the escarpment really begins to take effect. Players must favour the left hand side off the tee due to the severe left to right slope. A good tee shot will give the player the option to go for the green in two, giving the player an eagle chance or fighting for Par if they miss their 2nd shot. Once on the green, players will be challenged to figure out what is uphill or downhill. Seeing is not always believing on this green!

CLUB CHAMPION TIPS!

PLAY DOWN THE LEFT, ESPECIALLY ON YOUR LAY-UP. GREEN SLOPES HARD RIGHT TO LEFT, SO YOU MUST HAVE THE ANGLE ON YOUR APPROACH TO HOLD THE GREEN. DO NOT MISS THE GREEN LONG OR RIGHT. THE GREEN IS THE SMALLEST ON THE COURSE.

The 4th Hole at Lookout Point is one of the toughest Par 4's you will face on the day. At 465 yards, this long Par 4 plays uphill the entire way to an uneven fairway for your 2nd shot. The green is surrounded by mounds and a bunker on the left side, making it difficult to save Par. Players are advised to favour the right side of the green, which kicks everything back to the centre. Once on the green, be satisfied with a 2-putt and move to the 5th tee.

CLUB CHAMPION TIPS!

PLAY UP THE RIGHT SIDE - EVERYTHING KICKS LEFT. GREEN SLOPES LEFT TO RIGHT, SO BEING ON THE RIGHT ALLOWS YOU TO HOLD THE GREEN. DO NOT MISS LONG OR LEFT. YOU CAN GET UP AND DOWN FROM SHORT AND RIGHT ALL DAY LONG.

The Par 3 5th Hole is a short Par 3 to a slightly elevated green. Ranked as one of the easiest Par 3's on the course, players are advised not to shoot for the pin, but aim for the centre of the green. The two bunkers left and right make for a difficult Par save. This hole is a chance to make up a stroke or two before facing the tough Par 4 6th.

SHORT PAR 3. SIMILAR TO #2 WITH A SMALL GREEN. DO NOT MISS RIGHT. MISSING LEFT OR SHORT ALLOWS A GOOD CHANCE TO SAVE PAR.

LOOKOUT POINT C.C. - HOLE #6 (PAR 4)



On the Par 4 6th Hole, the importance of your tee shot is not how long you hit it, but where you hit it. A 3-Wood or Hybrid is recommended to leave a mid to low iron approach shot over a large valley. Players are advised to play short and avoid going long behind the green, making for a very tough up and down. With 3 sections to this green and a valley in the centre, each tier has its own challenges as you attempt to avoid bogey on your last Par 4 of the front nine.

CLUB CHAMPION TIPS!

FAIRWAY IS UNDULATING, BUT THE FLAT SPOT IS ON THE RIGHT SIDE AT THE 150 STAKE (230 YARDS). DO NOT CHALLENGE A REAR PIN, AS GOING LONG WITH A REAR PIN IS TORTURE. PLAY FOR THE MIDDLE AND ESCAPE WITH PAR.

The 7th Hole is a beautiful 526 Yard Par 5. With a heavy tree line on both sides, you will face an uphill battle the whole way. The ideal tee shot favours the right side of the fairway, enabling some players to challenge this green in two. If you lay-up, continue to favour the right side and allow a better angle into this tricky green. Even the seasoned veteran at Lookout Point still has difficulty reading this green. Consider 2-putts a victory and move to the 8th Tee.

CLUB CHAMPION TIPS!

EVERYTHING KICKS LEFT, SO PLAY UP THE ENTIRE RIGHT SIDE. GREEN IS SLOPED SEVERE FROM LEFT TO RIGHT, SO DON'T MISS LONG OR LEFT. YOU CAN GET UP AND DOWN ALL DAY FROM SHORT RIGHT.

LOOKOUT POINT C.C. - HOLE #8 (PAR 3)



The final Par 3 of the front nine is 175 Yards; however, plays a minimum of two clubs longer than advertised due to the elevated climb to the green. Originally known as Presbyterian Pass, a straight and narrow tee shot is the key to success in hitting this green. Any tee shots left short will roll down 10-15 feet. Despite the green atop the hill, the green slopes severely from back to front. Par here is a good score!

THERE IS ABOUT 25-30 YARDS LEFT OF THE GREEN YOU CANNOT SEE THAT IS FAIRLY FLAT AND GIVES YOU AN EASY UP AND DOWN. DO NOT GO ON THE HILL RIGHT. GRASS IS ANKLE HIGH AND VERY UNEVEN.

Your 9th Hole of the day is a 522 yard Par 5, and is the only hole at Lookout sitting on top of the Escarpment. A demanding tee shot with out of bounds on the right side and a large pond to the left will catch any mishit drives. Choose your 2nd shot wisely to avoid the deep valley that leaves a difficult blind 3rd shot. The 9th has one of the largest greens at Lookout Point, guarded by bunkers left and right. The green slopes heavily back to front, more than it seems.

CLUB CHAMPION TIPS!

REACHABLE PAR 5. O.B. RIGHT. HIDDEN POND LEFT, BUT IT'S A BIG POKE. THE GREEN IS ACCESSIBLE AND YOU CAN BOUNCE THE BALL ONTO THE GREEN. GREEN LOOKS FLAT, BUT PUTTING FRONT TO BACK IS VERY SLOW AND BACK TO FRONT VERY FAST.

LOOKOUT POINT C.C. - HOLE # 10 (PAR 4)



The 435 yard Par 4 10th Hole is one of the most demanding tee shots you will face during your round. With out of bounds running tee-to-green down the right side, and heavy treeline left, a good tee shot will leave a mid to low iron approach to an island green and a hidden bunker at the rear. Missing the green means a challenging up and down. All golfers should be satisfied writing a Par on the scorecard when leaving this green!

GREEN IS SEVERELY SLOPED BACK TO FRONT WITH A GULLY IN FRONT AND A HIDDEN BUNKER BEHIND. DO NOT GO LONG OR LEFT, AS UP/DOWN WILL TAKE A MIRACLE OF BIBLICAL PROPORTIONS. GULLY IN FRONT IS A GREAT OPTION COMPARED TO LONG.

The difficult 11th is the only Par 3 on the back nine, playing 195 Yards. With out of bounds on the right, this tee shot requires one of your best swings of the day. The green, which falls off in every direction, is protected by sand both left and right. Playing as the toughest Par 3 at Lookout, this hole demands accuracy to make Par. Making a birdie here will definitely give you honours on the Par 5 12th Hole.

LONG PAR 3 WITH O.B. RIGHT. MISS THE GREEN LEFT OR SHORT AND AN UP/DOWN IS VERY POSSIBLE. DO NOT GO LONG OR RISK A BOGEY OR WORSE!

LOOKOUT POINT C.C. - HOLE # 12 (PAR 5)



The 12th Hole is the last Par 5 at Lookout Point and gives the player an opportunity at Birdie before finishing your round with six Par 4's. This hole has an inviting fairway that is protected by a lone fairway bunker down the right and a small pond down the left. A good tee shots gives the player an option to Lay-up short of the green or go for this green in two. On your approach shot, players are advised to play short, as any shots over the green are hard to find.

CLUB CHAMPION TIPS!

REACHABLE PAR 5 WITH A HIDDEN POND LEFT AT 250 AND O.B. DOWN THE RIGHT. EITHER THREAD THE NEEDLE AND GO FOR THE GREEN OR LAY BACK TO 120 YARDS. THE GREEN IS NOT AS FLAT AS APPEARS AND ACTUALLY SLOPES QUICKLY FROM FRONT TO BACK.

The 453 yard Par 4 13th Hole is one of the most picturesque on the day. Your tee shot must not only carry a large pond, but reach the top of an elevated fairway. A slight dogleg right, this two-tiered fairway challenges players to hug the right side for the best angle to the green. Your approach is to one of the smallest and most difficult greens on the course. Protected by two bunkers, every pin position will challenge even the most seasoned putters!

UPHILL PAR 4 WITH MORE ROOM RIGHT THAN IT APPEARS. THIS IS THE ONLY GREEN YOU CAN HOLD FLAG HIGH. MISSING THE GREEN LEFT IS BETTER THAN RIGHT, BUT THIS IS A RARE HOLE THAT UP/DOWN IS POSSIBLE FROM BOTH SIDES.

The Par 4 14th Hole plays a lot longer than advertised. The hole plays uphill off the tee, protected by out of bounds down the right side and a treeline down the left. Your 2nd shot to this green should be short because the green placement leaves no room for error. Any shots long will find a collection area, making for a difficult up and down. This hole leaves even the most experience golfer satisfied with Par.

CLUB CHAMPION TIPS!

HOLE IS TIGHTER THAN IT LOOKS FROM THE TEE. HOLD YOUR BREATH AND PLAY DOWN THE LEFT SIDE OF THE FAIRWAY. GREEN IS FAIRLY FLAT WITH SOME BAIL OUT AREAS ON BOTH SIDES, BUT DON'T GET CARRIED AWAY, O.B. IS LONG AND RIGHT.

LOOKOUT POINT C.C. - HOLE # 15 (PAR 4)



Your 15th Hole of the day is a 336 yard Par 4 with a unique fairway, forcing players to keep the ball left due to an overhanging tree to the right. Players can try driving the green or play it short of the tree and take a chance at Birdie from the fairway. Any approach shots going long or left will leave a challenging Par save.

CLUB CHAMPION TIPS!

"GRIP IT AND RIP IT" PAST THE TREE. IT IS DIFFICULT TO HOLD THIS GREEN FLAG HIGH, SO LAND THE BALL ON THE FRONT OF THE GREEN AND LET IT RELEASE. GREEN SLOPES RIGHT TO LEFT, SO THE MISS IS SHORT AND LEFT. DO NOT MISS THE GREEN RIGHT OR LONG.

LOOKOUT POINT C.C. - HOLE #16 (PAR 4)



The short Par 4 16th Hole requires a 200-220 yard tee shot for the ideal position to approach this narrow green site. With a small protected green, players are advised to hit the centre of the green due to the false front rejecting the short approach. Although the green appears flat, it actually slopes heavily from back to front. Even for the longest hitters, Birdie is more frequent from the Fairway than from just short of the green.

SHORT AND TIGHT PAR 4 WITH TREES ON BOTH SIDES. STRAIGHT IS KEY ON THIS HOLE. THE GREEN IS RECEPTIVE, SO YOU CAN ATTACK ON THE APPROACH FOR A BIRDIE. ANOTHER RARE HOLE WHERE UP/DOWN IS POSSIBLE FROM ALL SIDES.

The 420 yard Par 4 17th is one of the toughest holes at Lookout Point. This hole demands your best tee shot of the day. An uphill tee shot guarded by a small pond left and a large bunker down the right, finding the fairway is a must in order to hit the green in regulation. A mid-iron approach by most players is protected by front bunkers on both sides and a false front making for a difficult Par save. Run-off areas surrounding this green make hitting the centre a priority.

The short Par 4 18th Hole can be characterized by caution in all directions. Don't get fooled by the yardage as this 321 yard hole actually plays much longer as it takes you back up the escarpment. A two tiered fairway is protected by bunkers left and right with a shot down the middle key to hitting this green in regulation. Once on the surface, don't count your chickens just yet, as a 3 or 4 putt lurks from every pin position. This is one of the most difficult greens you will ever face.

Is there bag storage?

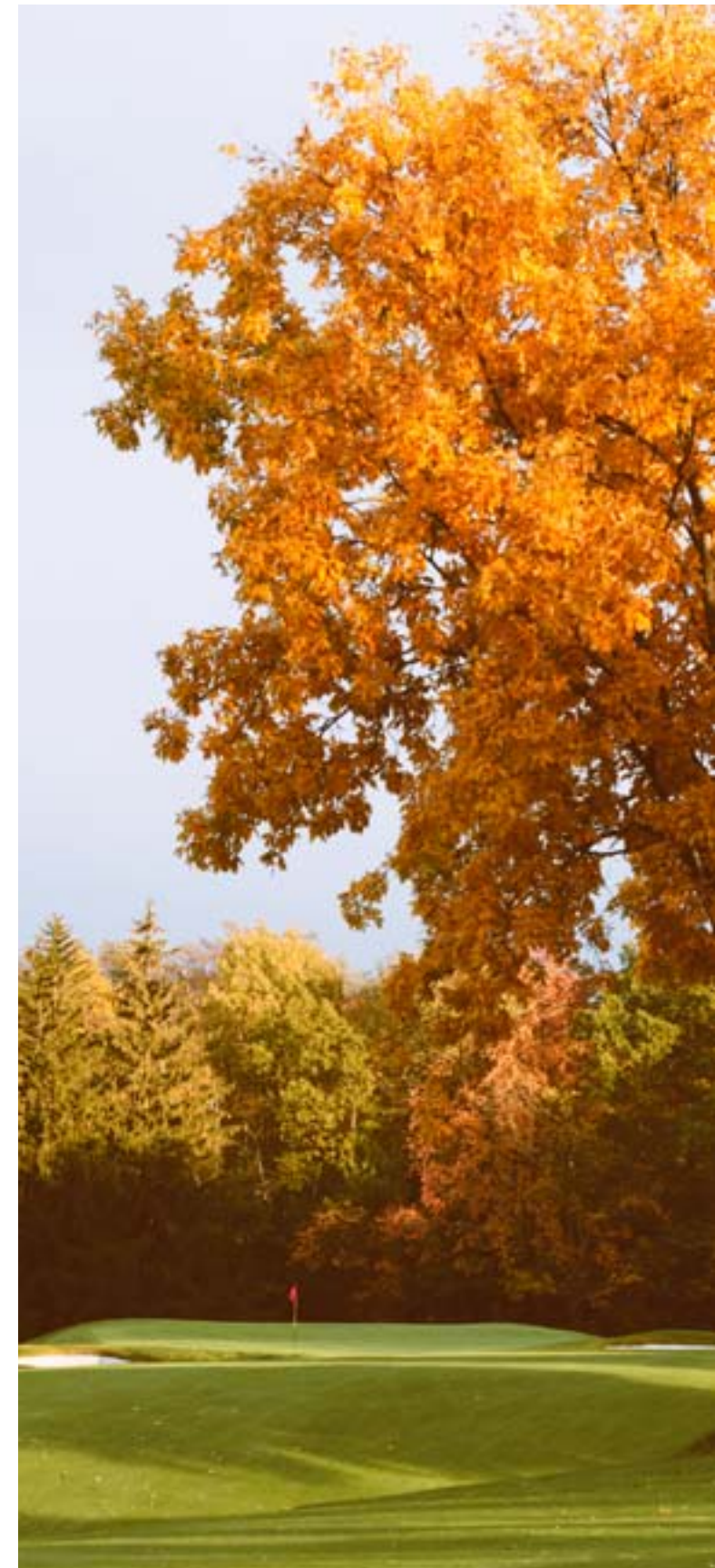
