NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

This information supplements the 2025 Local Rules and Terms of Conditions for the GTA AM Tour. The current issue of the Golf Canada Rules of Golf govern play. **Any rules on the host club scorecard do not apply. Penalty for breach of a Local Rule is the general penalty, unless otherwise noted.**

1. **OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 18.2):** See GTA AM Tour Hard Card for how Out of Bounds is defined.

Driving range / practice area between holes #4 & #5 is in play and part of the General Area.

2. **HOST CLUB DROP ZONES ARE NOT AVAILABLE:** Any Drop Zone available at this event will be indicated by a GTA AM Tour sign.
3. **PENALTY AREAS (Rule 17):** Red and yellow lines define the edge of the penalty area. Where penalty areas are not marked with lines, the change in the height of the grass defines the edge of the penalty area. Where there is no change in the height of the grass, the penalty area is defined by its natural boundaries. Unmarked penalty areas are red penalty areas.

The red penalty area along the ridge on holes #1, #5, #7, #9, #17 & #18 extends to infinity.

DROP ZONES AVAILABLE:

HOLE #12: For a ball that enters the yellow penalty in front of the green, another ball may be put in play using Rule 17.1d(1) or (2) or *as an additional option may use the Drop Zone* located on the forward tee deck.

4. **OBSTRUCTIONS AND GROUND UNDER REPAIR (Rule 16.1 applies):** Any areas of ground under repair will be marked or noted.

NO PLAY ZONES: Areas under construction, newly seeded areas, the clubhouse, areas that are ornamental garden beds, turf nurseries or decorative flowerbeds are No Play Zones that are to be treated as Ground Under Repair. Player must proceed under Rule 16.1f.

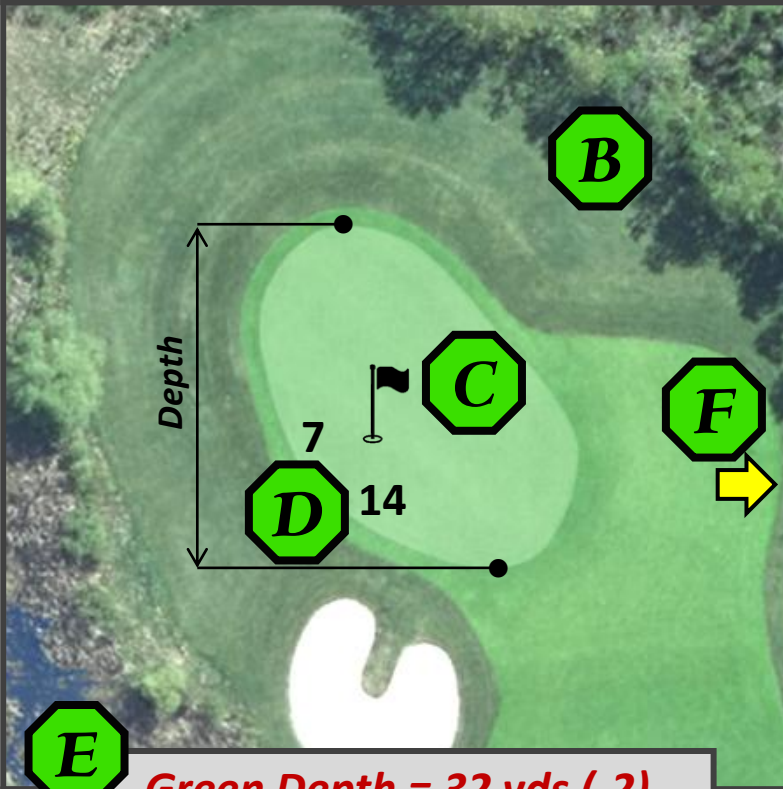
DROP ZONES AVAILABLE:

HOLE #18: When there is interference from lie, stance or swing from the clubhouse, garden or cart path behind the green, the player may find the nearest point of complete relief under Rule 16 or *may use as an additional option, the Drop Zone* located behind the green.

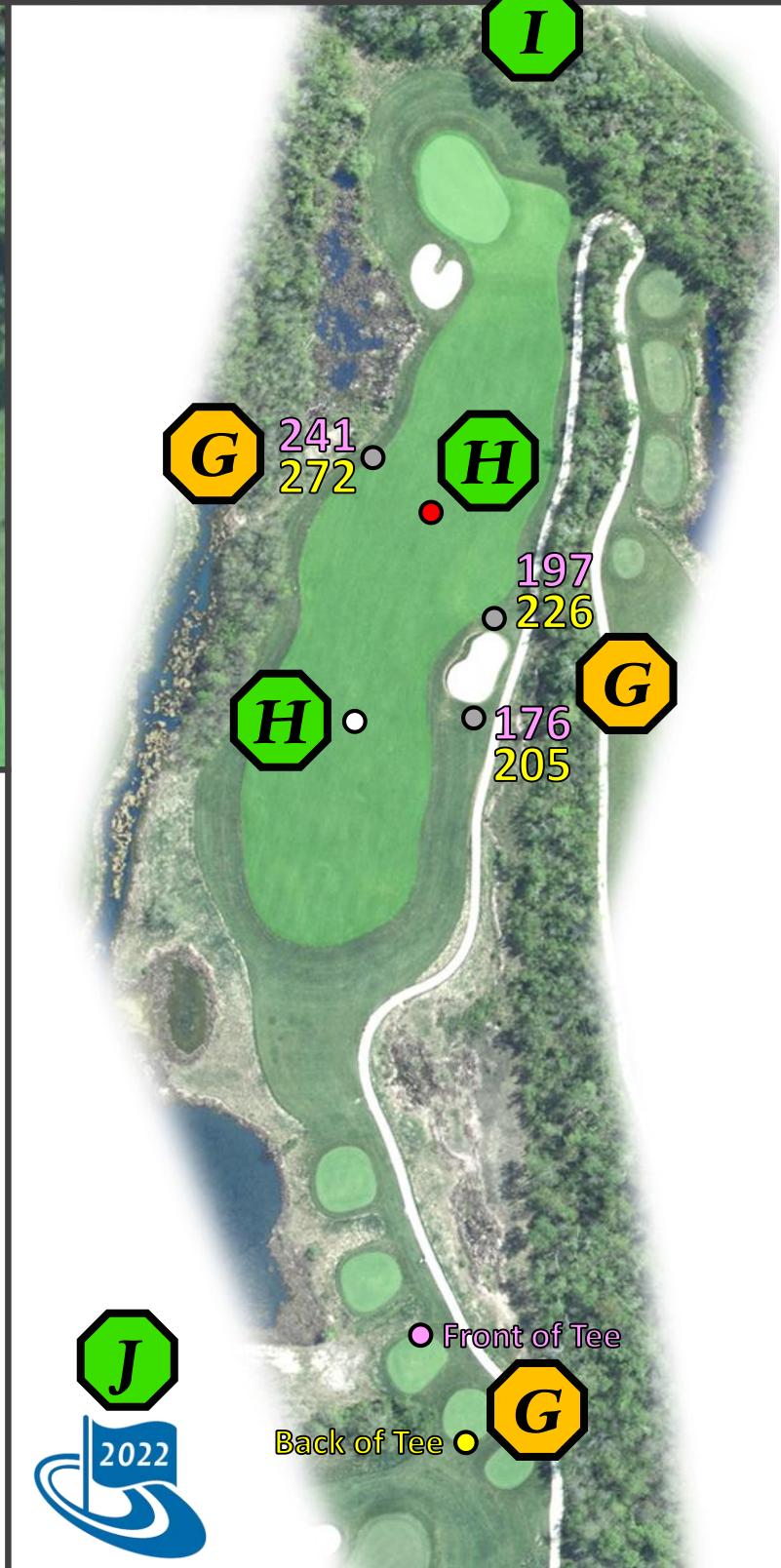

- D. Distances from the front and side of the green to the pin location.
- E. Green depth and a +/- distance from the centre of the green to the pin in brackets.
- F. Arrow indicating the direction to the next tee (leave your clubs here when walking).
- G. Distances from spots in the teeing ground ● ● ● to various locations in the landing area ○. The distance text is colour coded to match the teeing ground spots. The actual tee marker positions will vary, but differences can be quickly paced off or estimated.
- H. Standard 100 ●, 150 ○, 200 ●, and 250 ● yard markers.

On Your Way!

A straight-away Par 5 gets your day started. This hole requires a good tee shot and layup, leaving you with a wedge or short iron approach into a relatively small, undulating green that is very tricky. A great piece of local knowledge ... your putts will often break to the water, even though it might not look that way.

Side Hill Swing

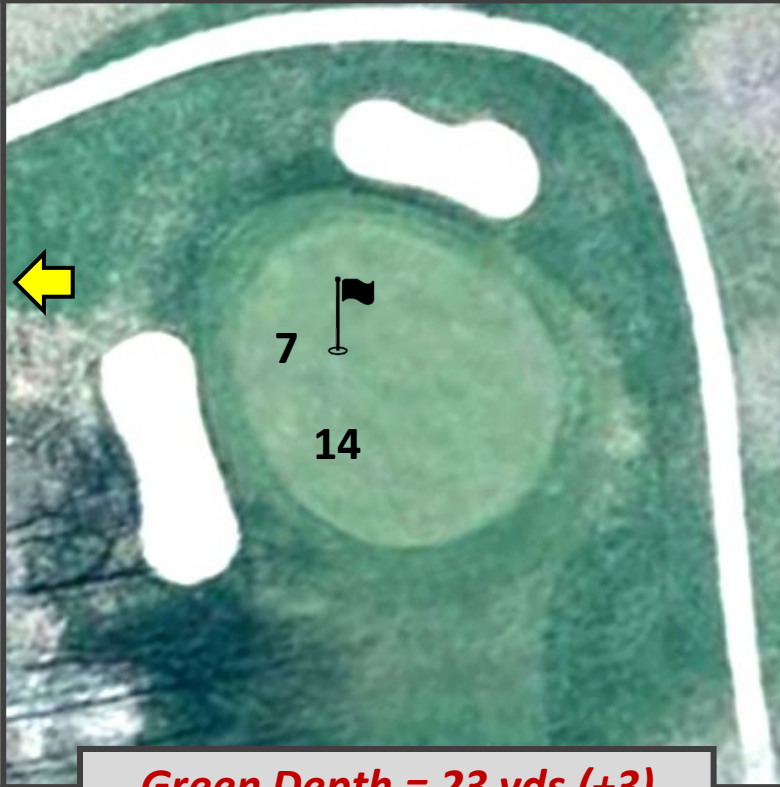
This simple-looking Par 3 is anything but easy. A narrow, two-tiered green makes hitting the surface challenging. The left-side hill can be your friend, but it can also be your foe. A pin location on the top tier will provide plenty of risk since over the back is a tough up-and-in. Putting from the bottom up to the top will showcase your putting prowess.

Green Depth = 23 yds (+3)

Timber Alley

It won't take long to see where the naming of this hole came from. Playing down a hallway of trees, a tee shot finding the left side of the fairway will give you the best angle for your approach. If you are going to miss somewhere coming into this green, short is best. The opening at the front of this green allows for shots to run up and makes for easier chips and pitches. A Par on this hole is a great score!

Green Depth = 26 yds (+7)

Corset Cut

You will be faced with a difficult tee shot to get this hole started, setting you up for either success or failure. A drive down the left side will introduce you to a towering pine that will interfere with your second shot. The green on Corset Cut is one of the trickiest on the course, so favour the left side of the putting surface. The left to right sloping green and a lower tier will want to drag your golf ball away from left pin locations!

Green Depth = 29 yds (-4)

Georgian View

A tee shot down the right side is the safest route. Flirt with the left side, and this could spell T-R-O-U-B-L-E. It would be best if you negotiated a gully that runs 100 yards from the green for your second shot. A decision must also be made to lay up short or carry it.

A tricky, undulating green will make it challenging to hole putts.

Westward Ho

Once again, a tee shot down the right side is ideal. Your second shot will be tricky, as this green presents a small landing area for you to putt from. A good portion of this green (short and left) is extremely sloped and will force your ball to roll off the putting surface ... creating a challenging chip or putt.

Green Depth = 22 yds (0)

Bridge of Sighs

Accuracy off the tee is at a premium on this intimidating hole. Choose a club that gives you confidence because “out of bounds” lurks down the right side.

The green is small, and slopes front to back. Landing the ball a little short is ideal for your second shot. It should roll up and hopefully give you a look at making a birdie.



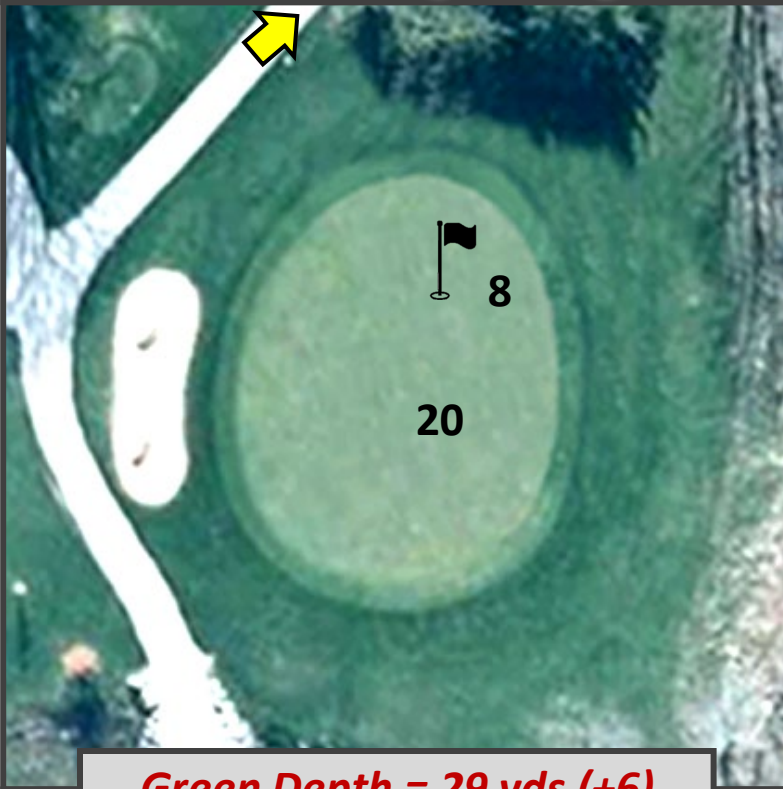

Green Depth = 29 yds (+6)

Devil's Drop

Get careless, and this “Little Devil” will punish you severely. The elevated tee makes it play shorter than the yardage, and wind can wreak havoc on your ball flight. Choose the right club, know the wind, and swing with confidence. You will then walk away feeling like an angel on this devilish little hole.

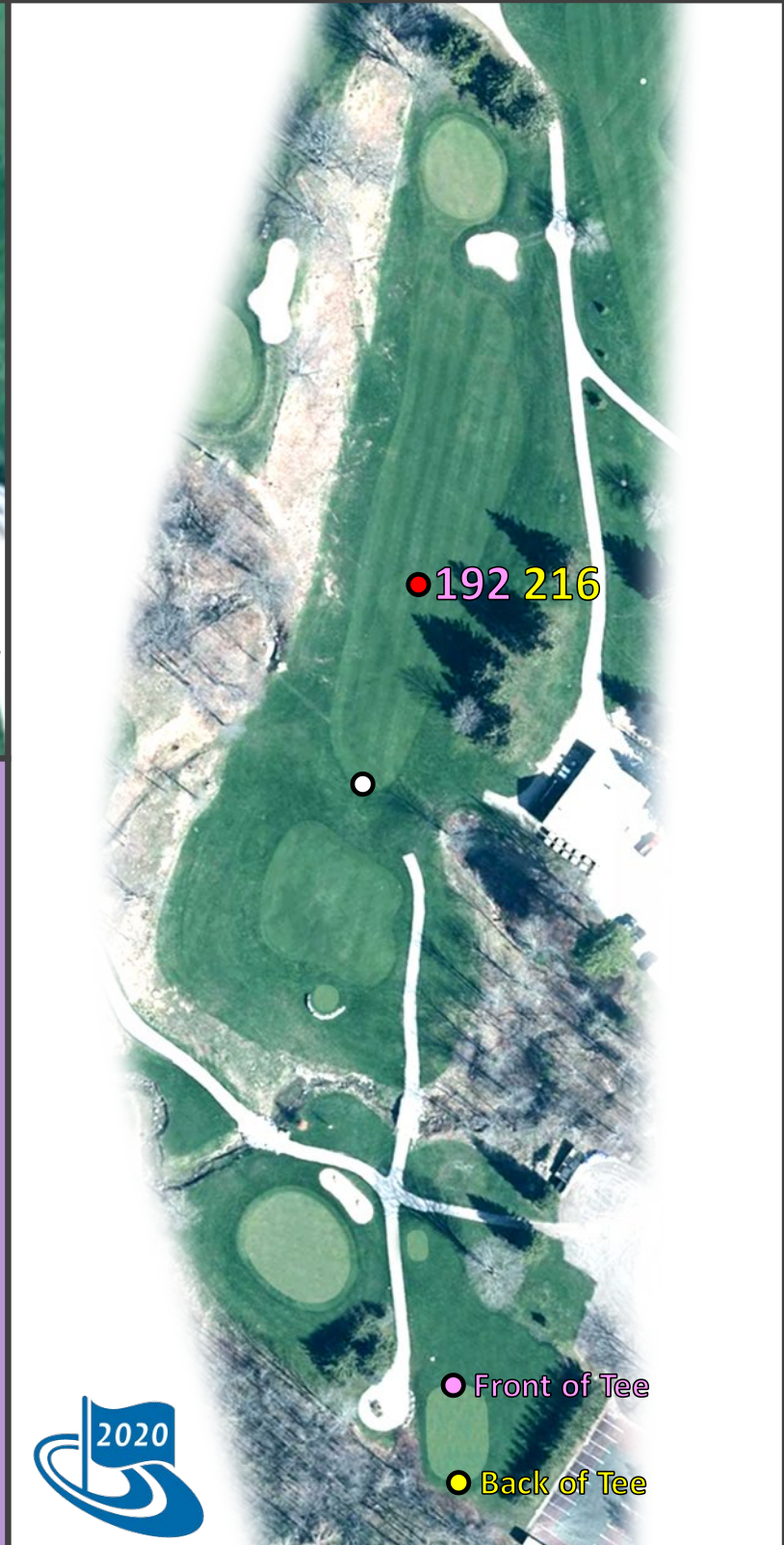

Green Depth = 24 yds (-5)

Legate's Gulley

A tee shot down the right side will be perfect. Avoid steering Your ball left toward the base of the ridge, as a side-hill lie, and overhanging branches will make hitting the green very difficult. Stanley's well-placed greenside bunker is ready to swallow any mishit approaches. Make Par or Birdie here, and cold beverages at the Halfway House will taste that much better!

● Back of Tee

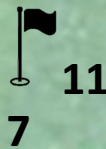

Lasting Legacy

This is a demanding Par 4 to reach in two for many golfers. The drive must be straight and long to leave you with a good chance of hitting the green. The second shot must be well hit to avoid the two yawning bunkers. With any luck, you will be left with an uphill putt. A four is a great score here!

Fiddler's Elbow

The key here is to try and get your tee shot out past the corner to approach the green directly. The fun doesn't stop there; your next shot is straight uphill to a very deep green. Remember to take an extra club or two. The pin location can also be a significant factor in club selection, and it's not uncommon to face one of your longest putts of the day on this green.

Gone Fishing

Over the years, numerous golfers have thrown their golf balls into the pond, giving this place its name. To achieve a positive outcome, this short Par 3 necessitates the correct club selection and a decent swing. Keep an eye on the wind, as it can sometimes be unpredictable.

Sunset Mile

This is one of the most challenging holes on the course due to its length. Making it worse, it is often played into the wind. A nice, solid draw for a right-hander is ideal. Your approach shot will be hit to the largest green on the course, guarded nicely by two big bunkers waiting to gobble up errant shots. This is another hole where you may have a long first putt.

Windjammer

This Par 3 is considered by many to be the most challenging of the five. Choosing the right club can differ by up to three or four depending on the position of the pin and the wind. As you stand on the tee and assess your approach, you'll notice a sizable bunker on the front left. Missing the green to the right is equally tricky and will require a skillful Par Save.

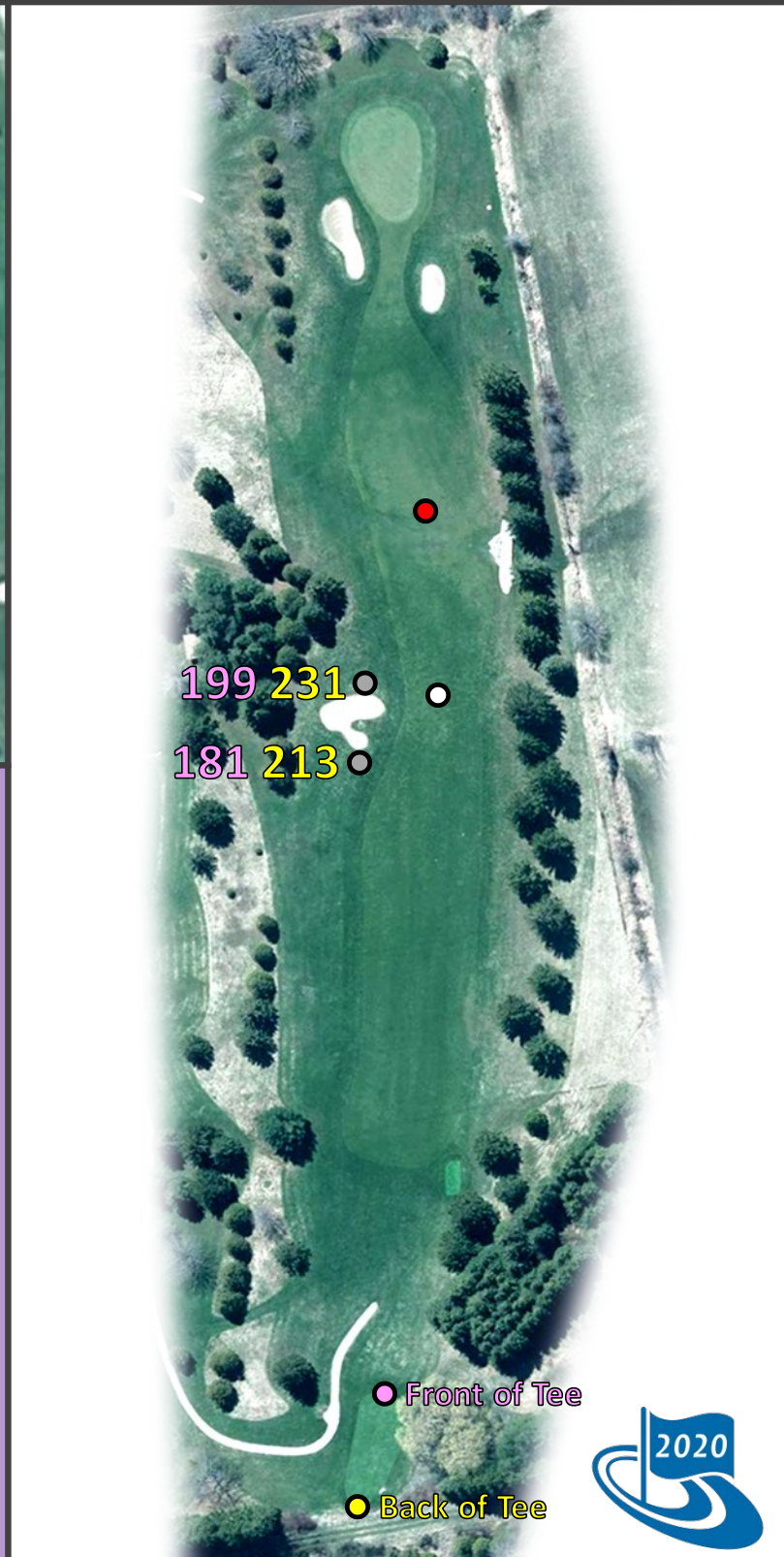


Green Depth = 32 yds (+11)

Spruce Alley

You can easily guess how it got its name from the spruce tree-lined hole. A precise tee shot will set you up for a good angle to aim for the pin.

As you approach the green, leave your shot below the hole since the green slopes steeply from back to front. Once you finish this hole, it's time for the trek home.

Home Run

What you see is what you get. This hole is straight away. You must hit one out of the park to get home in two on this brute of a Par 5. Out of bounds down the right side is this hole's biggest defence and will ruin many good rounds. Birdie is a great score. Par is a good score. Bogeys and higher are not uncommon.

Perfect Picture

Enjoy the view but maintain focus. This stunning Par 3 slopes downhill and is often accompanied by a tailwind. Using a club that is less than your usual selection from this distance is not uncommon. To focus on an attempt at a Birdie, aim to land your golf ball below the hole. However, you'll face a difficult up and down if you overshoot too long!

Homeward Bound

The 19th hole awaits! Our final hole is one of your best birdie chances. You could be on this green or very close with two good shots. Your drive should be in the fairway to make this a reality, so target your drive at the Turf Care Centre. A trap on the front right and trees on the left guard the green. If you avoid these perils, a Birdie putt is likely. Try not to get distracted by the chatter from the patio!
